Incident Summary:

The Cybersecurity and Infrastructure Security Agency (CISA) continues to monitor the evolving Coronavirus Disease, also known as COVID-19, situation closely. CISA is taking part in interagency and industry coordination calls and working with critical infrastructure partners to prepare for possible disruptions to critical infrastructure that may stem from widespread illness.

FEMA reports approximately 4,425,485 (+86,827) cases and 302,059 (+4,940) deaths worldwide. In the US there are approximately 1,455,210 (+24,702) cases and 88,381 (+1,257 deaths).

CRITICAL INFRASTRUCTURE IMPACTS

ENERGY

(Oil)

The Energy Information Administration forecasts oil prices will average about \$27 in 2020 and will not recover to its 2019 levels until near 2024.

Bloomberg reports the 18 Very Large Crude Carriers (VLCCs) from Saudi Arabia are continuing to arrive on the Gulf Coast and West Coast. The VLCCs are bringing in approximately 50 million barrels of Saudi crude oil which if allowed to unload, will offset almost all the US production cuts.

FOOD AND AGRICULTURE

Reporting indicates the COVID-19 pandemic is having a significant impact on the cotton industry due to the widespread shutdown of retail businesses. Cotton prices have dropped by over 25 percent in the first quarter of the



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year.

HEALTHCARE AND PUBLIC HEALTH

Operation Warp Speed (OWS), the administration's national program to fast-track the development, manufacturing, and distribution of COVID-19 vaccines, therapeutics, and diagnostics is projecting that a vaccine will be available by January 2021.

Mask manufacturers in China are reportedly changing the labels on their masks to read "non-medical" to bypass current restrictions on the export of medical masks; AZ Department of Health Services has affirmed that the masks meet requirements and allowing them for medical use in AZ.

A health care system in Central Florida said Saturday that it has terminated a contract with a third-party lab after concluding that more than 25,000 coronavirus tests it performed were unreliable.

Kansas National Guard is providing a mask fitting team to assist with testing of all CBTS staff completing 5,200+ tests and delivered 1,125+ cases of medical PPE to 23 counties.

ACTIVATIONS AND DECLARATIONS

NJ - All National Ambulance Contract (NAC) resources in New Jersey demobilized 16 MAY.

NY - State requested a phased demobilization of National Ambulance Contract (NAC) resources in the New York City area; approximately 85 units demobilized with an anticipated five units to be released daily, based upon State requirements until the end of the task order on 28 MAY.

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
